March 12, 2024

<u>Motion</u> to approve February 13, 2024 School Council Meeting Minutes made by Jacqui Lund. Seconded by Diana Lasso. Motion carried.

Motion to approve agenda for this School Council meeting made by Jacqui Lund. Seconded by Andrea Suarez. Motion carried.

Grade 1 Teachers' Presentation by Esther Bakshi, Deb Hercun, and Rob Cuclea.

Mrs. Bakshi spoke about targeted literacy. Classes are split during gym class, half in literacy groups and half in gym class. Students are learning about sounds, combining, and building how words are formed. They use pictures and multi sensory techniques to learn. They are also working on research for nonfiction writing, learning with dash facts and based on student interests.

Students will be working on story writing after spring break using puppets, loose parts, and small props. Also working on retelling the story and sequencing.

Q - How did the learning sprint mentioned go? The teachers did pre and post tests for the sprint period. Focused on phonetics and sounding out words in November and December. The results are very positive. The intentional practice on that skill and the small literacy groups lead to great results.

Mrs. Hercun spoke about social studies. Students are looking at their community, Calgary, and rights and responsibilities. They brainstormed the gifts that they get from Calgary. Mrs. Hercun shared a video of the ABCs of Calgary collaborative project that all classes did. Students will have a field trip with Calgary Open Minds spending time in downtown Calgary. They will be journalling and comparing the urban setting to where DRBS is and where they live.

Students did a project on the murals in the Beltline Urban Murals Project (BUMP). The kids voted on which murals they wanted to look at and studied the art. Drawing, journalling, and thinking about them. They are doing different activities to build confidence prior to going downtown and seeing the murals. Colour, shape, perspective, and thinking about what the artists are trying to say. The students will start at Dr. Carl Safran Center and then explore the community from there. All 4 classes will go at staggered times from April 29 to June 7. Spend a week doing the Open Minds program. They will meet artists architects, etc. and they can explore bridges, playgrounds and whatever the classes are most interested in.

Mr. Cuculea spoke about science including the new grade 1 science curriculum. Lots has carried over but there are some new topics added in. The science is very general. Teachers are looking to see what students are interested in and tailor the lessons. The work is more across the year as opposed to "units", they come back and revisit topics through out the year. They also mix in math, ELA, and other subjects in the learning.

All DRBS students are doing the conservation champions project. They're learning about polar bears and the moose in the neighbourhood. They are also using those interests to discuss conservation and will be going to the zoo and presenting their work to visitors. Students are studying appearance, diet, habitat fun facts, and how we can help animals.

In math grade 1 students are learning about numbers, geometry, and now statistics is in the new curriculum. Teachers conducted 3 math sprints. The first was making numbers and the second just started, looking at math language and multiple perspectives on math. The post tests are published on PowerSchool. Students are working on understanding the "why" of math and thinking about the concepts. Students are using manipulatives and games to learn the concepts.

Last year money was directed to learning resources. There were lots of things like books and manipulatives, used in math learning, purchased with Development Association funds. Thanks!

Principal's Update

Parent Survey Results

The results of the parent survey were presented, 36 were completed.

People are getting information on the School Development Plan from more places, not just Council, email and the website were high.

The majority agreed that their child's learning can benefit from the goals, actions and resources in the SDP.

There were comments, some related to school fees, curriculum issues, and lunchroom supervision fees. All these issues are beyond school control. There were also lots of questions about the SDP. There was also a comment about support for special needs students.

There is strong support for the activities the school is doing. A few parents expressed disagreement with indigenous learning but that is mandated in the Alberta curriculum.

Parents are mostly okay with the fees but there is disagreement with lunchroom supervision fees, but those are mandated by CBE. The same with the transportation fees.

The admin will continue to focus on field trips and education enrichment activities. They've had lots this year and are starting to organize for next year. This year grade 3 is still going to Drumheller and Activity Days are coming as well as Outdoor School for grades 5 and 6.

Q – Was there only 10% engagement? Yes, that's about double last year. It's low engagement but on par with other schools.

The school will be doing a Stampede breakfast. One grade 1 class will be doing a filed trip that day, but they will get a special ticket to eat first before they go.

Kim Howden discussed the 3-year school tech plan. The school has just completed the evergreening process, decommissioning old devices, and will be getting funding for new devices. The new tech budget is \$25k.

The school has just purchased 35 iPads and 32 Chromebooks. The school is going to Chromebooks as they are less costly and seem more reliable. They are also better for the students as they have only one login then they are in their Google Classroom accounts. In junior high and high school, it's all Chromebooks and PCs so moving away from Macs helps prepare them for the future too.

The school will be purchasing covers for the iPads but have only lost 3 iPads to damage since the school opened. The school can only purchase covers through the CBE vendor, which is pricy. They would have to get someone else to buy less expensive covers to avoid CBE rules.

The devices are in use constantly. Teachers book them and there are some dedicated classroom devices. They also use translation tools for English language learning students.

Q - Do you feel you have enough iPads? Yes, there is enough to meet needs. With the size of the school and the drop in Chromebook prices the school is able to afford enough devices.

Q – Are smart boards part of the tech plan? No, those are from a different budget.

The school can only have so many devices for equity with other schools so additional donations of tech and money will reduce the CBE tech contribution, not increase tech devices at the school. There are other things the Development Association could fund that don't create the same claw back. Because current devices were purchased at school opening many things are starting to go at the same time.

The CBE ratio is 3 students to 1 device equalling about 2 hours per student per day. The kids are using the devices regularly.

Chair Update

Jacqui Lund presented a proposal for a School Council/Development Association continuity succession plan. The proposal is to have a 3-year cycle starting with a person acting as vice chair, then chair, and finally past chair. This will improve the continuity of the leadership and hopefully get more people involved by lowering the barrier to participating and providing more ongoing support.

In discussion participant were largely supportive.

Q - Can members of the Council/Development Association create a succession report, each position could leave a document guiding the role and helping the new person?

To be discussed next meeting in preparation for amending the bylaws in future to allow the succession plan.

Secretary's Update

Treasurer's Update

Quarterly financials will be available for the next meeting. Costs are tracking the budget with no major variances. The 2023/2024 budget didn't include the playground phase 2. We will need to approve this with a formal motion. We have the funds budgeted now but we need to formally approve the phase 2 budget.

We have received \$125k in grant funding and need to match it with our spending. Last year we spent \$105k, we've got \$140k left to spend. Casino proceeds will pay for the remaining bits.

The Parks Foundation grant (\$20k) may not be available as our project doesn't match the purpose of the grant. Jacqui is looking into it further.

Next meeting, we will have the 2024/2025 budget to review. The budget doesn't hinge on the Parks Foundation grant but it may make the budget tight next year.

Natasha recommends spending on the playground phase 2 to not lose the match grant money which we would have to pay back.

We can pursue other grant funding or defer payments to the school to better match cashflow. We have a casino next year.

Q - How much will we enter the 2024/2025 year with if we spend this \$140k? We are exiting this fiscal year with \$30k in the bank projected. The year ends August 2024. In a typical year we need about \$60k to match the payments to the school and administration costs for the year (resources, residencies etc.) Will need to make sure we have funding coming in. The casino is in Q1 2025 and funds usually come in 2-3 months later.

<u>Motion</u> to approve spending up to \$140,000 for the phase 2 playground made by Natasha Monk. Seconded by Carrie Plesuk. Motion carried.

Playground Coordinators' Update

Discussion of the playground survey responses. There were 182 responses. We had some technical difficulties with the survey intro not going out.

Biggest support is for the basketball nets. There are some families concerned with removing the small playground, but it has to be removed as it's past its end of life. Some families are sad to lose the swings and some of the smaller equipment.

Including swings in the new playground is hard because of the limited student use and the large amount space required. We could only fit 2 swings with current requirements.

Least support is for gagaball but admin and staff are super supportive. It is likely that lots of people don't know what gagaball is.

The spider web climber is very highly supported by the school staff. It would replace the small playground and help meet the smaller/younger students' climbing desires.

Q - Should we investigate the possibility of swings based on the feedback? Students will miss it but swings are of limited use. The spider net and gagaball can accommodate 20+ students each while swings is 1 or 2 per swing.

The spider net climber doesn't move or rotate. There are spinning ones but they are not recommended because they have high maintenance needs.

Q – Does the plan include benches and picnic tables? They only came up once in the survey. Admin feels that students can use the outdoor classroom space for seating. Benches and tables can be added in future as one-off items.

Discussion of some other ideas like a wood climbing structure or climbing wall. Admin prefers the spider net.

This should all fit in the budget. If there is more room, the playground team will come back to the Development Association to determine options.

The 3rd quote is expected soon so a decision will not be expected until next meeting.

CBE will cover the cost of the small playground removal in July. Our construction will begin in late July or August.
